Founded in 2010 by lifelong area resident Bill Crawford, Team Mojo Foundation is a grassroots all-volunteer nonprofit organization serving school-aged (K-12) children in the local Tri-State area. Their coverage area is based on school districts and includes East Liverpool, Beaver Local, Wellsville, Northern Hancock County, Midland, American Spirit Academy, and other local charter and cyber schools.

The foundation's mission is to provide financial assistance to underprivileged children who qualify through their application process, to enable them to participate in events and activities they otherwise would be unable to without help. Instead of specializing in one area, Team Mojo has helped kids with the costs associated with a wide array of experiences; including sports, cheerleading, scouting, field trips, Camp Fitch, karate, dance, gymnastics, music lessons, tutoring, band camp, prom, graduation, drivers ed, and more. They have provided nearly \$200,000 in assistance to more than 4,000 kids in their six years of existence, all in the local Tri-State area. Their online application is apply.teammojofoundation.org.

Crawford serves as Executive Director and the Executive Officers are President Jeremy Williams, First Vice-President John Stoakes, Second Vice-President Maria Boyd, Secretary Belinda Dunlap and Treasurer David Bickerton. Eight local high school seniors serve on Team Mojo's Student Advisory Council. The 2016-17 members are East Liverpool's Lindsay Baker, Tyler Adkins and Ethan Mercer, Beaver Local's David Mellinger and Logan Bouscher, Wellsville's Hunter Ulbright, Oak Glen's Emilie Troutman, and ASA's Erin Tenney.

Through a network of community leaders, school faculty, coaches, clergy, civic organizations and many volunteers, Team Mojo Foundation has developed a presence that is well-known in the community, which according to Crawford was his original vision; families in need think of their services when a hardship arises. Team Mojo Foundation is funded through grants from other charitable organizations, generous donations from business and individuals, and their own fundraising efforts. All donations are tax-deductible as the foundation is an IRS-recognized 501c3 tax-exempt nonprofit organization. Upcoming events this year include An Evening with Mojo on March 25th at the East Liverpool Country Club and The Mojo Open, an individual golf tournament at Beaver Creek Meadows July 22-23.

Team Mojo Foundation has been recognized as a Jenco Award Winner by the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio and received the Lou Holtz Upper Ohio Valley Hall of Fame's first MVP award last June for its local volunteer work.
